

Don't Know If You're Registered?



If you think you're already registered, you can check your voter registration status at:

www.VoterStatus.sos.CA.Gov

To check your voter registration status, you will need the following information:

- ✓ First and Last Name
- ✓ Your Date of Birth
- ✓ Your California driver license, California identification card number, OR the last four digits of your social security number



Pro Tip

- Don't forget about conditional voter registration, also known as same-day registration— which allows you to register to vote in person at a polling place on the day of election!

envelope matches your ID signature.

- Double check your CA Driver's License or ID to make sure your signature on the envelope matches your ID signature.
- You **do not need a stamp** to mail back your ballot in the envelope that comes with it!
- Drop it at a drop-off location or in a ballot drop-off location within the state
- Return it in person to any polling places before Election Day
- Mail it to your county elections official on or before Election Day

Pro Tip

- You go to the registration table, a poll worker can answer any questions you have.
- Remember: if you are voting in-person, you have to go to a polling place in the county where you are registered to vote!

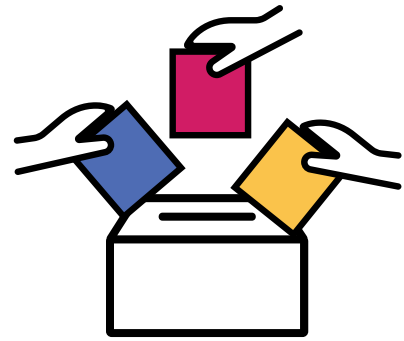
If you vote by mail, fill out the ballot that is mailed to you and return your ballot in one of the following ways:

County elections officials will mail vote-by-mail ballots to all active registered voters. Make sure to check your registration status!
